5G conspiracy and Faith

Minister Manis Uduoborie explores two 5G conspiracies through the lens of the Gospel.

There are two strands to the 5G technology conspiracy. The first claims that 5G weakens the immune system thus making people vulnerable to catching the virus. The other suggests that the virus is transmitted through the use of 5G technology. The allegation that the government has an agenda is fundamental to both of these strands.

Have you considered that God often uses conspiracy as an act of judgement against his enemies? For example, He caused the King of

Assyria to 'hear a *rumour* so that to he may `*fall by the sword in* his own land (Is. 37:7). It was a conspiracy that made the children of Israel, *`turned back to* the iniquities of their ancestor'(Jer. 11:10). This is why He warns us not to, 'say it is a conspiracy in regard to what this people (world) call a conspiracy (Is. 8:12). The implication is that even in times of trouble, we must fear God more than we fear the evil actions of people (Is. 8:13). Our faith in God's sovereign rule keeps us stable when

others are paralysed by fear.

For this reason, the Christian sees the wickedness in the world as an opportunity to show the attractiveness and holiness of God (Mt. 5:13-16). S/he is not captured easily by the tides of conspiracy theories because God also uses the evil actions of people to advance His plans for us (cf. Gen 50:20). This is why Paul was thankful for his imprisonment since his suffering advanced the gospel (Phil. 1:12-14). Similarly, the early



Christians never blamed others for their predicaments. They submitted joyfully to God's sovereign rule (Acts 5:41). There was no scope for conspiracy in their theology.

So the main issue for us is not whether the 5G conspiracy is true or not but rather, whether we believe God can advance His agenda through it. At the time Paul was writing the book Romans, Nero was in the process of blaming the church for the fire that destroyed almost three quarters of the city of Rome. Yet, Paul wrote that Christians '*must submit* himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God (Rom 13:1). Today, Nero is dead awaiting judgement, but the Church is alive awaiting glorification (Rom. 8:30).

If the 5G conspiracy turns out to be accurate, I have no doubt that God will also use the 'faster downloads, instant streaming and instant connection' it promises to advance His gospel. In the interim, there is no better time to proclaim the gospel to those who are hurting than now.

Have you considered what God might be doing through this period of uncertainty? Do not underestimate your capacity to bear fruits in a season of drought (Jer. 17:8).
