

### IT'S EASTER, SO WHAT?

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3 v.16

You cannot ask a question like that. After all, Easter is the born again believer's most important time of the year. If it was not for that ultimate sacrifice that Jesus made then none of us would be here with direct access to our Heavenly Father. I will ask again, "It's Easter, so what?" So, what will you do in response to the sacrifice Christ made for you?

Each year we read the Bible story of the Passion of Christ, the suffering, the sacrifice, and His resurrection. The account we read in the Bible never tires. Every year we receive a new revelation of God's love for us, and though we know this period leads to the death of Christ, there is life in every aspect of the Passion of Christ.

There is something we can do in response to Christ Jesus' ultimate sacrifice on the cross. That sacrifice culminated in death but as we read earlier, that sacrifice was all about life. It is still about life today. Will you receive that life offered to you? That is the response you need to make today - accept the life Jesus is offering you.

We have a tendency to complicate simple things. That too has been sorted in the words of Jesus in John 3 v.16:


