"I DO BELIEVE, HELP ME OVERCOME MY UNBELIEF"

Mark 9:24 encapsulates the struggle between genuine faith and persistent doubt. Following a dramatic scene in which a father has brought his demon-possessed son to Jesus for healing after the disciples had failed, Jesus says "Everything is possible for one who believes" (Mark 9:23). In response, the father, who I imagine was desperate, said to Jesus 'I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!'

The father's cry, "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!", is a raw and transparent admission of a common experience. Faith is not a state of perfection, but often a struggle.

"I do believe": This declaration confirms our faith in Jesus' power and is what motivates us to bring our needs to Jesus. Faith, though imperfect, is real, powerful, and touches the heart of God.

"Help me overcome my unbelief!": This is an honest acknowledgment of doubt that can linger from time to time. Knowing that our human frailty can be a hindrance in exercising faith, this recognises that faith is not a self-generated force but a gift that requires God's help to flourish.

This prayer is a powerful model for us all. It moves beyond a superficial display of confidence and embraces conversation with God about our inner struggles. It embraces humility, urgency and honesty.

Jesus did not condemn the father for his mixed faith. Instead he responds with love and grace, demonstrating that divine power is not relying on perfected faith. In verse 25 Jesus heals the boy with compassion and power. As we go through this month and reflecting on our theme for 2025, know that while faith is essential, God honours a sincere heart.

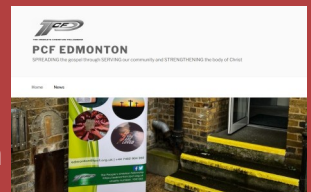
